Insurrection at the Capitol Prompts Response from ICUNJ Presidents

On January 6th, a mob of supporters of U.S. President Donald Trump, stormed the United States Capitol by rioting and violently attacking the 117th United States Congress, in an attempt to overturn his defeat in the 2020 presidential election. These actions prompted statements from the Presidents of several of our member institutions. Presidents of [Princeton University](#), [Seton Hall University](#), [Rider University](#), [Drew University](#), [Fairleigh Dickinson University](#), and [Centenary University](#) publicly denounced the acts of violence that took place against our democracy.

ICFNJ Distributed \$42,000 in CIC/UPS Scholarships to New Jersey Private Colleges and Universities

The Independent College Fund of New Jersey (ICFNJ) has distributed \$42,000 in CIC/UPS Scholarships to assist 13 students at private colleges and universities in New Jersey. The scholarships were made possible by a grant from the Council of Independent Colleges (CIC) in Washington, DC, through the CIC/UPS Educational Endowment.

“We are delighted to be part of the CIC/UPS Educational Endowment Program that recognizes highly qualified students for scholarships. We applaud UPS for their long-term commitment to students of independent institutions across the country. There could not be a more appropriate time than the present to support students with scholarship aid, and we are very proud of our 13 CIC/UPS Scholars of New Jersey.” said Lou Manzione, president of the Association of Independent Colleges and Universities in New Jersey.

Nationally, CIC provided more than \$1.5 million in student scholarships through state-based associations to make private colleges and universities more affordable and accessible to under-served students.
