Merger News

The Independent College Fund of New Jersey (ICFNJ) was founded in 1953 as a cooperative effort involving business and academic leaders of New Jersey to broaden financial support for and awareness of independent higher education. The Association of Independent Colleges and Universities of New Jersey (AICUNJ) was founded in 1966 to collectively represent the individual colleges and universities of New Jersey at the state legislature. These two organizations will complete a merger – to the single non-profit organization, Independent Colleges and Universities of New Jersey (ICUNJ) – in summer 2021 to build upon synergies and to more efficiently and effectively advocate on behalf of the students who are served by independent colleges and universities in New Jersey. The Boards of both entities will be asked to support the merger during votes in May. Upon completion of the merger, the ICUNJ Board will be comprised of the 14 independent college and university presidents plus four executives from the New Jersey corporate community. The organization will also be supported by 60 corporate leaders from across the state of New Jersey who will serve as a Board of Advisors.

Legislative Budget Committees Testimony

We are grateful for Saint Peter's University President, Eugene J. Cornacchia's [testimony](#) at the Senate Budget Appropriations Committee hearing on April 13th and the Assembly Budget Committee on April 26th, [advocating](#) for the New Jersey independent colleges and universities. Dr. Cornacchia made a case for the importance of our sector in the state, how we have been impacted by the pandemic, and the importance of partnering with Governor Murphy, the Legislature, Secretary Bridges, and others in the Murphy Administration, on moving higher education in New Jersey forward.

Meeting with NJ State Assembly Speaker Craig Coughlin

On April 16th our presidents, other campus staff and Lou and Dave met with New Jersey State Assembly Speaker Craig Coughlin (D-19) and Assembly Majority (Democratic) Office Executive Director Anthony "Skip" Cimino to discuss issues of importance to our institutions and our students. Each president or campus representative provided a "elevator" remarks on their institution and the Speaker spoke about his interaction with many of our institutions including a rainy graduation at Centenary in which he ruined a pair of pants. He also talked about the work he has done on many issues including his hunger initiative package of bills and other issues. An open discussion dealt with the challenges campuses face with mental health issues, the impact of COVID on campus finances as well as challenges that could result from the legalization of adult use cannabis. We thank Speaker Coughlin and Skip Cimino for the opportunity to discuss the issues impacting our campuses and students.

2021 Virtual Education Career Fair

On April 20th, Fairleigh Dickinson University Career Center hosted the 2021 Education Career Fair for students and alumni of NJ private institutions interested in careers in the education sector. The event was held virtually on the Handshake platform. Eighty-six (86) registrants from 11 of our member institutions participated. The 54 employers who participated conducted 140 one-on-one sessions and 45 group sessions. The students and employers alike reported a successful event.
